

YOUR SUPPORT MATTERS

The paddle raise will directly support the museum's Creative Foundations Program, which provides underprivileged K-12 Title 1 students access to educational art programs, fostering creativity and cultural engagement.

In July 2023, the museum was awarded a prestigious grant of \$178,288 from the California Cultural and Historical Endowment (CCHE). This funding has enabled the museum to serve over 1,700 Title 1 students since October and will serve another 1,800 Title 1 students before July—far exceeding initial expectations. The grant funds education for a total of 5,000 students, which we expect to surpass during the fall of 2024.

Because we are serving so many students, we will use up all of the funding from the CCHE grant in the next year.


The Creative Foundations Program serves Orange County's low-income students. By removing the barrier of cost and providing transportation to the museum, the program ensures that children and families with limited economic resources have access to art education that provides a foundational understanding of art, culture, and their own artistic expression. One teacher shared, "I can't express how wonderful this was for my kids. Our student population does not get the opportunity to enjoy fine art."

With funding ending, we need your support in order to continue providing thousands of students from underprivileged communities access to quality arts programming. **Raise your paddle today.**

As a result of participating in the Creative Foundations Program:

- 90% of students learned something new during their museum visit
- 100% of teachers reported that regular classroom activities will be or have been enhanced by the school tour experience.
- 100% of teachers reported that the school tour experience reinforced student knowledge in art, social studies, English, language arts ande other content areas.



Rebecca Campbell completed her MFA in painting and drawing from the University of California, Los Angeles, in June 2001. Her work has been exhibited nationally and internationally at various galleries and museums, including L.A. Louver Gallery, Ameringer-McEnery-Yohe, Gagosian Gallery, the Phoenix Art Museum, the American Academy of Arts and Letters and the Cornell Fine Arts Museum at Rollins College.

Campbell currently works as an associate professor at California State University, Fullerton, and has previously taught at Art Center College of Design, Claremont Graduate University, Vermont College of Fine Art, Anderson Ranch Arts Center, and the Idyllwild Arts Academy. Her artwork is frequently featured at art fairs such as Art Basel, Art Basel Miami Beach and ARCO Madrid. Her work has been published in several publications, including ARTnews, the Los Angeles Times, ART PAPERS, X-TRA, ARTWORKS Magazine, Art Ltd., The Huffington Post and Artnet. L.A. Louver Gallery represents her work.

Laddie John Dill is a renowned artist from Los Angeles who had his first solo exhibition in New York City back in 1971 with Ileana Sonnabend Gallery. He was among the first Los Angeles artists to showcase "light and space" work in New York. Since then, he has exhibited his "Light Sentences" and "Light Plains" in various institutions across the United States and globally, and these pieces have gained renewed interest in the last decade. Recently, the Museum of Modern Art in New York acquired a "Light Plains" sculpture which is currently on view in the museum.

Dill has been creating luminous sculptures, wall pieces, and installations using light and earthly materials like concrete, glass, sand, and metal since the 1970s. When asked about his choice of materials, Dill cites the influence of artists like Robert Rauschenberg, Keith Sonnier, Robert Smithson, Dennis Oppenheim, and Robert Irwin, who explored earth materials, light, and space as alternatives to easel painting.

Sara Genn is an artist from Canada who currently resides in New York City. Genn is recognized for her skilled use of color and patterning in soft-edge abstractions. She often draws inspiration from landscapes, personal objects, or textile design to challenge our traditional perception of painting and craft. Her artwork demonstrates her mastery of color concepts and a deliberate, handmade representation of her internal world. She considers her plein-air practice to be an important influence on her work as an abstractionist.

Her artwork has been showcased in various publications, such as Canadian House and Home, NYLON Japan, Town and Country, W, Domino, American Art Collector, New York Magazine, LONY, and Tatler. Additionally, her artwork is featured in the Rizzoli publication New York Parties: Private Views and for the Faberge Big Egg Hunt.

Raffi Kalenderian, a Laguna Beach native, is known for painting portraits of his young friends in an ultra-flat two-dimensional space, where he creates intricate abstractions out of patterns on clothing and furniture. For Raffi, the social aspect of painting is incredibly meaningful because he believes that technology can be isolating. Sitting with a friend for a few hours while observing them is a great way to slow things down.

His work not only captures the sitter but also their complete psychological framework, including their environment. To achieve this, he sometimes depicts a doppelganger alongside his subjects. In his 2008 portrait of Matt Lydon, the figure is surrounded by an abstract network of patterns and lines, appearing to struggle to break into three-dimensional form from the flat background. The painting is imbued with a sense of angst and tension. A circle defines a rug in the painting, and pillows emerge from small strokes of color.

Elyse Pignolet is an American with Filipino heritage who was born in Oakland, CA and is currently based in Los Angeles. She received her BFA in Ceramics from California State University Long Beach in 2007 after studying in Barcelona, Spain.

Her primary medium is ceramics and her work is inspired by various social issues and urban themes. Through her art, she attempts to relate the traditions of ceramics and the permanence of the medium to the fleeting and transitory nature of the contemporary world. Elyse has completed several public art projects, including three large murals at the SFJAZZ Center in San Francisco and the Gaffey Street Public Swimming Pool in Los Angeles' San Pedro neighborhood.

Ed Ruscha, a renowned artist, was born on December 16, 1937, in Omaha, Nebraska. In 1941, his family moved to Oklahoma City where he spent most of his childhood. Ruscha moved to Los Angeles in 1956 to attend the Chouinard Art Institute and graduated from there in 1960.

His early paintings, which were part of the Pop art movement of the 1960s, caught the attention of many. His art encompasses influences from Dada, Surrealism, and Abstract Expressionism and is central to the Conceptual art movement. Ruscha creates paintings, drawings, prints, photographs, artist's books, and films; his work can be found in the collections of major national and international museums. Ruscha currently lives and works in Los Angeles and is represented by Gagosian.



John Sonsini is a renowned painter based in Los Angeles who has established himself as one of the foremost portrait painters of his generation over the last 40 years. He is known for his skillful use of oil paint and his portraits of men painted directly from life, capturing both their physical appearance and psychological presence. The thick paint, lively brushwork, and distorted drawing in Sonsini's paintings all recall Alice Neel's portraits, which were also grounded in the relationship between painter and subject.

Born in Rome, NY, in 1950, Sonsini received his BA from California State University Northridge in 1975. He is best known for his portraits of Latino laborers, which are both highly personal depictions and references to the politics of immigration. Sonsini pays the men he recruits from hiring posts an hourly rate to pose as themselves, wearing their own clothing and taking their own postures and expressions.





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

Delivery or Pick Up

The relevant Artwork will not be made available for delivery or pick up unless or until the Museum receives in clear funds all amounts payable to it per "Payment Terms".

If you have elected to pick up the Artwork and fail to make a pickup appointment within two business days of the Fall of the Hammer, the Museum and Affiliates will be entitled to contact the next highest bidder and declare them the winner of the lot

Insurance

Once the hammer falls, the risk associated with the artwork is transferred to the buyer. Hence, the buyer is solely responsible for arranging insurance coverage for the artwork. The museum does not provide transit insurance for artworks sold through auctions. If you request delivery of the artwork, the museum will not be responsible for any loss or damage caused during transit.

Remedies for non-payment

If the Buyer fails to make payment per Payment Terms when due, the Museum is entitled to exercise one or more of the following rights or remedies (in addition to asserting any other rights or remedies available under the law):

- (a) to hold the Buyer liable for the total amount due and to commence legal proceedings for recovery along with interest, legal fees and costs;
- (b) to cancel the sale:
- (c) to reject at a future auction held by the Museum any bids made by or on behalf of the Buyer or to require the Buyer to pay a deposit before accepting any future bids; and/or
- (d) to take such other action as the Museum deems necessary or appropriate.
- (e) to offer the artwork to the backup bidder after 2 days of non-response to Payment Terms.

If the Museum does sell the Artwork per this clause, then the defaulting Buyer will be liable to the Museum for the payment of any difference between the Hammer Price originally payable and the Sale Price obtained upon sale to the backup-bidder, as well as any Fees (commissions and Buyer's premiums) that the Museum would have received on the original sale and all costs, expenses, damages and legal fees incurred by Laguna Art Museum or the Seller or the Seller's Affiliate as a result of the Buyer's default.

If the Museum chooses to pay any amount to the Seller, up to the net proceeds that the Seller would have received from the Hammer Price, which the defaulting Buyer failed to pay, the Museum will have all the rights of the Seller to pursue the Buyer for that amount, regardless of the reason.

Proceeds to LAM

All proceeds from the sale provide funding for LAM after applicable commission to the donating artist and Artsy fees are deducted.
